Dear Families,

I hope this newsletter finds you all well. Amazing that it is already the end of October! It has been a busy fall with a lot going on around the school.

At last the construction of the library has begun. While being under construction will present some challenges, I am very excited for the end product. The new library will be beautiful and transform our school in amazing ways. The project schematics are posted on the wall across from the office if you would like to see the particulars.

I wanted to take this time to update you on the next steps for the construction work. This evening the temporary walls will be put in place to block off the construction zone. The construction area will include the old IC and Counselor offices and the entire inner courtyard. The library will be in just a portion of the courtyard, but the entire space is needed for staging and to ensure safety around the construction work. I will post in the office a map of the construction area and the three week schedule of work being done. A majority of the work will be done on the swing shift (3:00pm to 11:00pm). There will be some work done during the day, but the noisy, disruptive work will be done in the evenings. The construction site will be fully walled off and insulated. There will be some windows installed in the temporary walls so that we can all see into the site and see the progress.

Todd Construction is the company that will be doing the work. They have done a lot of different projects in the district over the years. They have implemented a comprehensive plan for workers who are on site. Workers are required to sign in inside the Todd Construction trailer before coming on to the job site. After signing in with their name, the date and the time, workers will then go into the job site directly. All workers are required to wear a high visibility shirt and a hard hat with a sticker that identifies them as having checked in. The movement between the construction trailer and the work site will be through specific pathways designed to minimize construction worker presence in the rest of the school. For the most part, workers will only be in the job site and not within the rest of the school.

I know that being under construction will have its challenges and opportunities. However, I also know that the finished product will be amazing. We are so fortunate to be having this renovation done to our school. Thank you to the community for making this possible! I will be in close contact with Todd Construction and the district project manager to help this be as smooth a process as possible. Again, Todd Construction has done a lot of work for the district and has a track record of being very responsive, thoughtful and considerate of the school environment.

I cannot wait to see our new library come to life. As always, if you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to be in touch.

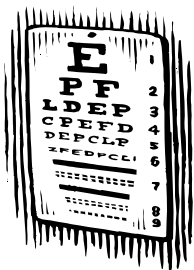

FOOD SERVICE DEPARTMENT

Dear Parents, Teachers, Building Occupants, and Employee Organizations:

In the past, asbestos was used extensively in building materials because of its insulating, sound absorbing, and fire retarding capabilities. Virtually any building constructed before the late 1970s contained some asbestos. Intact and undisturbed asbestos materials generally do not pose a health risk. Asbestos materials, however, can become hazardous when, due to damage or deterioration over time, they release fibers. If the fibers are inhaled, they can lead to health problems, such as cancer and asbestosis. In 1986, Congress passed the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) which requires schools to be inspected to identify any asbestos containing building materials. Suspected asbestos-containing building materials were located, sampled (or assumed) and rated according to condition and potential hazard. Every three years, **West Linn Wilsonville School District** has conducted a re-inspection to determine whether the condition of the known or assumed asbestos containing building materials (ACBM) has changed and to make recommendations on managing or removing the ACBM. At the last re-inspection, all materials listed in the Management Plan as asbestos containing (or assumed to be asbestos containing) were inspected and found to be in good condition. The law further required an asbestos management plan to be in place by July 1989. **West Linn Wilsonville School District** developed a plan, as required, which has been continually updated. The plan has several ongoing requirements:

- publish a notification on management plan availability and the status of asbestos activities
- educate and train its employees about asbestos and how to deal with it
- notify short-term or temporary workers on the locations of the asbestos containing building materials
- post warning labels in routine maintenance areas where asbestos was previously identified or assumed
- follow set plans and procedures designed to minimize the disturbance of asbestos containing building materials
- survey the condition of these materials every six months to assure that they remain in good condition.

The following buildings contain no asbestos-containing building materials; therefore, no operations and maintenance programs or future inspections are required:

- Athey Creek Middle School
- Boeckman Creek Primary School
- Boones Ferry Primary School
- C.R.E.S.T.
- Rosemont Ridge Middle School
- West Linn High School (except the 700 Building)
- Wilsonville High School

For details concerning asbestos related activities such as, current asbestos removal, maintenance, or periodic surveillance in district facilities, please review our Asbestos Management Plan Notebooks which are located in each facility and at the District Operations Center. The plans are also available on the District website. It is the intention of **West Linn Wilsonville School District** to comply with all federal and state regulations regarding asbestos and to take whatever steps are necessary to ensure students and employees a healthy and safe environment in which to learn and work. You are welcome to review a copy of each Facility Asbestos Management Plan kept on file in our District Operations Center or at each site during regular business hours. 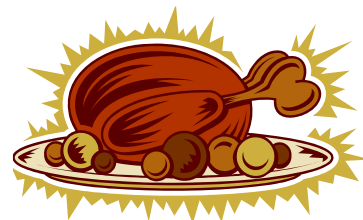

With the health of children in mind, as well as their preferences, the West Linn – Wilsonville School District has supported nutritious lunches as an important component of the Wellness Program. November's primary menu consists of healthy foods, designed and developed by an experienced nutrition team, with collaboration from many.

Homemade, fresh and simple entrees such as a brown rice chicken Bento, baked potatoes with low fat mozzarella cheese, and a taco salad made with shredded cheddar have replaced chicken nuggets, fries and nacho's with cheese sauce. Highly processed entrees are being phased out. Instead, hand assembled pizza, a low-fat, whole wheat version of tuna and noodles as well as traditional favorites such as a simple cheese or turkey sandwich or a soft taco made with lean beef on a whole wheat flour tortilla are now featured.

Fresh and locally sourced produce includes apples, oranges, pears, lettuce, broccoli, zucchini, kiwi, cherry tomatoes and radishes. Carrots and celery are organic. Produce grown at CREST and in the school gardens have been highlighted in the lunchroom.

As children become more adventurous, we hope they will give the homemade quiche a try and continue to keep the momentum going when enjoying the array of fresh vegetables being offered. We will be sampling additional new and healthy foods each month and asking children if they enjoyed them.


Trans fat, MSG and growth hormones in milk have been eliminated for some time. Nitrites and nitrates are gone. High fructose corn syrup is on it's way out, with only a small amount contained in the spaghetti sauce. (We are working on that now.)

Kettle chips, a Northwest original with no artificial ingredients, low fat Sunchips, homemade granola bars and whole wheat cookies (with Bob's Red Mill ingredients and honey) will be offered occasionally.

Choices of fruits & vegetables, plain nonfat milk, 1% milk, and 100% juice are served every day. A plain cheese sandwich or a sunbutter & local jam (SBJ) sandwich are available daily but may not be listed on this menu. (Sunbutter is made from sunflower seeds, tastes just like peanut butter, and has a minimal allergy risk.) Whole wheat sandwich breads, rolls and hamburger buns are made by a local bakery. They contain honey, not high fructose corn syrup (HFCS) and are made from wheat grown in the Northwest.
